

LOSS OF H.M.S. PATHFINDER.

CASUALTIES AMONG THE CREW : 242
REPORTED MISSING.

The casualties among the officers of the light cruiser Pathfinder, which was sunk by a mine in the North Sea, were announced in yesterday's DAILY GRAPHIC. Last night the casualties among the crew were issued by the Admiralty through the Press Bureau. These show the following :—
