Pte. WILLIAM ADLAM, who died of wounds received in the Dardanelles, had been stationed at the Depôt from October, 1908, and was for about four years batman to Sergt.-Major House. He had numerous friends in the neighbourhood, and is remembered by many for the capital way in which he recited "How Bill Adams won the Battle of Waterloo." On mobilization he rejoined Chatham headquarters and was detailed for the Chatham Battalion of the R.M. Brigade, R.N. Division. He had been 16 years in the Service and was 37 years of age. He left a wife and two children, living in Deal.
