

SERGT. CHAS. RIEU (U.C.S. 1885-91)

Rieu, Charles (U.C.S. 1885-91), Sergt. Middlesex Regiment, second son of the late Dr. Charles Rieu and Mrs. Rieu, of 28 Woburn Square, was killed on September 13, 1917, aged 42. The third of the brothers to give his life for the cause of the Allies. At the outbreak of war was living in France and enlisted August, 1914, in the Foreign Legion. He was "trained at Toulouse and sent to the French front, December, 1914. In 1915 he was withdrawn from the Foreign Legion together with all British subjects, and he then joined the 16th Middlesex (Public Schools Battalion). He was sent to France with that unit with his two brothers in November, 1915, and saw much active service. After the death of his two brothers he was transferred in September, 1916, to the Army Intelligence, was promoted Sergeant, and met his death

after a year's work. All three made splendid soldiers and did their duty for their country." House W.
