WILLIAM FRANK BAKER

Second Lieutenant Lancashire Fusiliers • son of Mrs. Ellen Baker of Maida Vale • killed in action at Vimy Ridge on 16th May 1916 • buried at Ecoivres.

JOHN JOSEPH BALL

Lieutenant Royal Field Artillery • University College • son of Dr. and Mrs. J. Barry Ball of Upper Wimpole Street • killed instantly by a shell at Hebuterne while acting as forward observing officer on 27th June 1916 • buried at Hebuterne.

OSWALD FREDERIC GREVATTE BALL

Second Lieutenant General List and Royal Flying Corps • King's College • son of Mr. O. Ball of Shoreham • killed in action on 5th April 1917 • buried at Aubigny.

SAM GERALD BARDER

Second Lieutenant East Surrey Regiment • son of Mr. and Mrs. A. Barder of Brondesbury • killed by machine gun fire within a few yards of the objective at the last and successful attack on Schwaben Redoubt north of Thiepval on 30th September 1916.

THOMAS CHESMAN BARKER

Second Lieutenant Royal Engineers • University College • son of Mr. and Mrs. Chesman Barker of Finchley • killed instantly by machine-gun fire on the completion of a floating bridge across the Oise-Sambre Canal between Ors and Cattillon on 4th November 1918. The Victoria Cross was awarded to Sapper Adam Archibald of the same company, the 218th Field Company, in connection with the construction of this bridge which was essential for the success of the operations • buried at Ors.

EDWIN JAMES BARNETT

Lieutenant Royal Engineers • Northampton Polytechnic Institute • son of Mr. E. W. Barnett of Barking • killed in action on 7th August 1917 • buried at Dickebusch.

REGINALD BARRETT

Second Lieutenant Lancashire Fusiliers • Royal College of Science • son of Mr. and Mrs. Barrett of Burnley • killed in action at Vimy Ridge on 16th May 1916 • buried at Ecoivres.

WALTER RALPH BARRETT

Lieutenant Essex Regiment • London Hospital • son of Mr. W. E. Barrett of Woking • killed in action on 2nd November 1917 • buried at Gaza.

REGINALD OWEN BASSHAM

Second Lieutenant Rifle Brigade • University College • son of Mr. Luke Bassham • killed in action on 31st May 1917 • buried at Tilloy.

ALBERT BASWITZ, M.C.

Captain London Regiment • B.Sc., King's College and London Day Training College • son of Mr. H. Baswitz of Fulham • killed in action leading his company at High Wood on 15th September 1916 • buried in Flat Iron Copse.

ERIC RAOUL HENDER BATE

Second Lieutenant East Surrey Regiment • University College • son of Mr. E. R. Bate • missing believed killed in September 1916.
