

**AKROYD, LIEUTENANT-COLONEL PERCY BAYLY**, son of Bayly Nash Akroyd by his wife, Nona, dau. of Richard Barron; b. at Brighton, Sussex, 1 October 1879; m. 15 June 1915 Maud Sendall, and has issue: Michael Bayly, b. 9 September 1923. Educated at Eton 1893-97 ((Sir) Walter Durnford's house); held a commission in the 3rd battalion of the Royal Fusiliers (the City of London regiment) 1897-1904; served in the South-African war on the remount establishment 1899-1902 (awarded the queen's medal and five clasps) and in the European war with the Royal Fusiliers and on the staff (mentioned in dispatches twice and awarded the brevet of major 1 January 1915); a partner in the stockbroking firm of Gordon L.
