



2nd LIEUTENANT CHARLES WILFRID BANISTER, 4th BATTN. THE ROYAL FUSILIERS (CITY OF LONDON REGT.),

who was killed in action at Hooze Château on the 16th June, 1915, was the third son of Howard Cottrell Banister, of St. Catherine's, Cadogan Gardens, Tunbridge Wells.

He was born on the 9th March, 1893, at Blundellsands, near Liverpool, and was educated at the Merchant Taylors' School, Great Crosby, and at Jesus College, Cambridge.



On the outbreak of war he received a nomination to the R.M.C., Sandhurst, and in February, 1915, was given his commission, and was posted to the 4th Battalion of his regiment. For training he was attached to the 5th (Reserve) Battalion, and was ordered to France on the 9th June, 1915, a week before he fell in action.
