



**Martineau, Alfred John** (U.C.S. 1882-90), Maj. Royal Garrison Artillery, killed in action, April, 1917, was the youngest son of the late Judge Martineau of the Sussex county-court circuit. By profession Maj. Martineau was a throat and ear specialist, having taken his degrees at Edinburgh and London, and he was a Fellow of the Royal Society of Medicine. For many years he was an officer in the Territorial branch of the Garrison Artillery, and, the force being mobilized on the outbreak of war, he was put in command of the fort at Newhaven. He went to the front with the siege guns in April last year. Maj. Martineau was 44 years of age, and had been connected with St. Thomas's Hospital, London, the Children's Hospital in Great Ormond Street, and Brompton Chest Hospital. At U.C.S. he was a Monitor. House W (Mr. Thompson's).
