ARTHUR GEORGE EDWARD EGERTON

Lieutenant-Colonel Coldstream Guards • son of the late Colonel Sir Alfred Egerton, C.B., and of the Hon. Lady Egerton of Buckingham Palace Gardens • killed in action at the Battle of Loos on 29th September 1915 • buried at Vermelles.

The Senate of the University on 20th October 1915 adopted the following Resolution:

"That the Senate desire to express to the widow of Lieutenant-Colonel A. G. E. Egerton their deep sympathy on the death of her husband, who was, upon the establishment in 1909 of the University of London Contingent of the Officers Training Corps, appointed to be the first adjutant of that Contingent. He devoted himself very strenuously to the welfare of the Corps for four years, and was successful in raising it to a high degree of efficiency."

WILLIAM BRIGGS GRANDAGE

Lieutenant-Colonel Royal Field Artillery • M.D., B.A., Cambridge; St. Bartholomew's Hospital • son of Mr. and Mrs. A. Grandage of Rawdon near Leeds • killed in action by a shell while walking to the headquarters of an infantry brigade near Swan Chateau on 14th May 1917 • buried at Lijssenthoek.

CYRIL MORTIMER GREEN

Captain Royal Sussex Regiment • B.Sc., Wales; University College • son of the late Rev. T. Mortimer Green of Aberystwyth • killed in action in Palestine on 6th November 1917 • re-buried at Beersheba.

GORDON CLUNES McKAY MATHISON

Captain Australian Army Medical Corps • D.Sc., London; M.D., Melbourne; University College • died in May 1915 of wounds received in the Dardanelles.

RICHARD DRUMMOND MAXWELL

Captain University of London Officers Training Corps • M.D., London Hospital • died in London on 6th March 1916.

JOHN BENJAMIN KNOWLTON PREEDY

Lieutenant London Regiment • M.A., University College King's College and London Day Training College • son of Mrs. Preedy of Highgate • killed in action at Poelcappelle on 26th October 1917.

GERALD WILLIAM WEST

Lieutenant Royal Sussex Regiment + King's College + son of Mr. H. F. D. West of Balham + killed in action at the Battle of Loos on 25th September 1915 + buried at Le Rutoire,
